Animals are things that are living and are not plants.

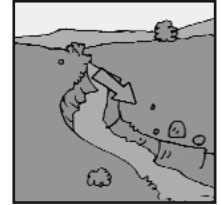
Dogs, birds, fish, and bugs are all animals.

Home base is the last place a baseball player must touch to score a point.

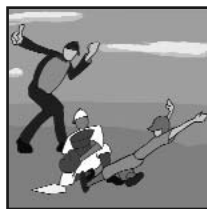

When you pay, you give money for something.



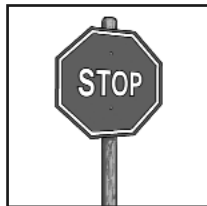

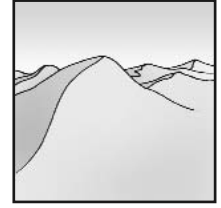
cacti¹⁴

snakes¹⁵

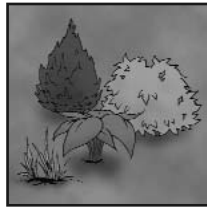
Snakes are long, thin animals with no legs. *Snakes move by sliding on the ground.*

Trees and grass are kinds of plants.



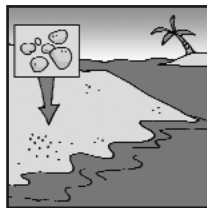

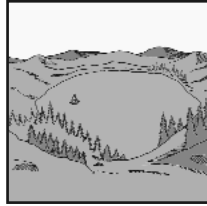

An ocean is one of the huge bodies of salt water that cover most of Earth's surface.

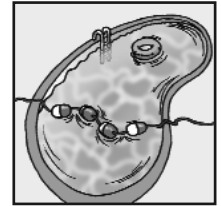

Spaghetti noodles are hard before they are cooked; they get soft when they are boiled.

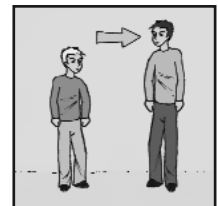

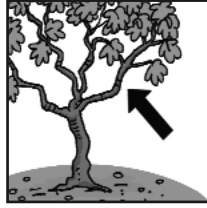

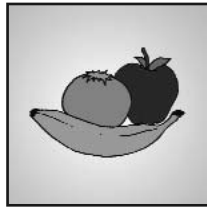
Dust is very little pieces of dry dirt.

rests¹⁵

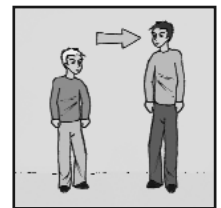
Rests means lays or leans.

Trains

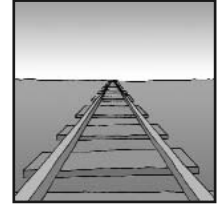
caboose²⁴

tracks²³

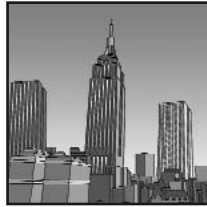
Tracks are the two metal bars on the ground that trains move on.



city²¹

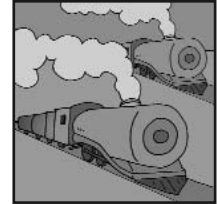
A city is a busy place where many people live and work.

The city where Joan lives has many streets, parks, and tall buildings.



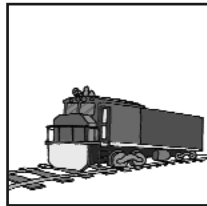
trains¹⁹
