## How Do Students Log In?

- Need appropriate device and internet
- Go to: readlive.readnaturally.com or use iPad app
- Enter student credentials
  - Account ID (000#####)
  - User ID
  - Password
- Make sure to log out when done; sessions are saved

## Tips to Help Parents

- Student's Guide to Read Naturally Live
- Provide PDF of stories for parents to review and for student to use for comprehension support
- Adjust story options to allow students to perform cold timing independently
- Emphasize parent can assist student when help is requested but student should be working mostly independently

## Tips to Motivate Students

- Create a monthly chart for the refrigerator. Have student color in a block for each story completed per week.
- Challenge student to see how often they can get 100% on the guiz guestions on the first attempt.
- Create a goal of xx number of stories completed each week, and provide rewards.
- "Motivation That Sticks!"
- Over 100 articles that mention "motivation" on our web site.


Parents as Assistants

### Read Live Assistant Role

- Do not give parents your password.
- Account admin or school coordinator can create a Read Live Assistant.
- Assistants can conduct timings and choose remedial actions, but can't view or modify student data.
- Create ONE Assistant account or MANY.
- Provide training resources, discuss expectations.

## What Can Assistants Do?

- From within the Student module:
  - Conduct cold timings and pass activities
  - Review student work
  - Reset story
  - Print stories
  - Print awards





## **Supporting Assistants**


- Assistant can log into Staff module with their Assistant ID

Adjusting Story Options

## **Adjust Story Options**

- Allow student to perform cold timing without requiring teacher or parent to be present.
- Access from Staff or Student modules.
- Make other adjustments as necessary. For example:
  - Adjust time or remove requirements for prediction and/or retell
  - Add Spanish read along for some students



- Email or print and mail
  - Welcome letter (ENG / SP)
  - Summer letter
  - Progress letter (Staff)
  - Certificates and awards (Staff)
  - Copy of story (Staff or Student)
  - Story details report (Staff or Student)

- You can share PDFs via Google Classroom, Zoom, or email to parents. If there's no internet at home, mail packets with stories and glossaries

# Combatting Summer Slide

## Reading skills adversely affected by pandemic...

"Overall, students' reading fluency in second and third grade is now approximately 30 percent behind what would be expected in a typical year.

Reading fluency is fundamental for academic development more broadly, the researchers said, because problems with this skill can interfere with students' ability to learn other subjects as they make their way through later grades."



## What is Summer Slide?

#### According to a Brookings Institute report:

- Learning and achievement are perishable students decline over the summer by one month of school-year learning.
- Summer slide contributes to a greater achievement gap.
- Research shows a link between socioeconomic status and the amount of loss of reading skills over the summer.
- Studies show older students lose more achievement over the summer than younger students.



## Faucet Theory

### Resource faucet during school year:

- Good teachers
- Strategic instruction
- Effective programs/curriculum

### Keep the faucet running in summer:

- Get students to the library.
- Keep the communication going.
- Assign work over the summer.
- Recommend a home version of a program that is successful at school.





Using Read Live Over Summer

## Considerations/Caveats

- Students may "use up" curriculum.
- Students will have the same goal all summer unless you intervene.
- Most parents are not trained educators and may not respond in ways that maximize student progress.
- Parents may be biased and scores may not be accurate.

## **Actions/Mitigations**

- Discuss plan of student work over summer with student's teacher for coming year.
- Monitor student performance by checking reports periodically. You may need to change goals, levels, options.
- Train parents, communicate expectations, and stay in contact over summer.
